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
CAMP RULES

Still Trusting in the Fire

1 Pet 1:6-7

Faith that endures the fire is more valuable than gold. Trials are not God's punishment—they are the soil where deep spiritual growth takes root.

Peter writes to believers facing persecution, urging them to remain steadfast in faith despite their suffering. Just as gold is refined in fire, trials test and purify our faith. While these experiences may bring sorrow, they are temporary—and they hold eternal significance. In the midst of hardship, joy is still possible because we know that God is working through it all.

The Purpose of Trials

Trials are not God's punishments, but act as instruments to refine our faith.

James 1:2-3 (NIV)

"Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance."

God allows such fiery tests in our lives to purify our faith, strengthen and deepen our trust in Him, and shape us to reflect His glory.

? Faith is Worth More Than Gold

While gold is highly valued, it will eventually perish. Genuine faith, however, yields eternal rewards.

2 Corinthians 4:17 (NIV)

"For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all."

This reminds us that the suffering we face now pales in comparison to the glory that is to come. God cherishes the trust we put in Him in our time of difficulties.

Joy in the Midst of Fire

Peter describes believers as being filled with "inexpressible and glorious joy." This joy does not stem from comfortable circumstances but from the certainty of our salvation.

1 Peter 1:5 (NIV)

"...who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time."

Even in the fire, we can rejoice—because we live in the hope of God's sovereignty and His good purposes for our lives.

Reflections:

- Am I struggling to trust God in the midst of trials?
- When difficulties arise, do I run away or press on with faith?
 What can I surrender to the Lord today?

Growth is a Spiritual Responsibility 1 Cor 3:1-3

Paul reminds us that spiritual growth isn't optional—it is the responsibility of every believer. True growth is measured not merely by how much we know, but by how our lives are being transformed.

In this passage, Paul expresses his deep concern about the spiritual immaturity of the Corinthian believers. He calls them "infants in Christ"—though they had accepted Christ, their lives remained marked by jealousy and quarrelling, revealing a worldly mindset. This serves as a sobering reminder: spiritual maturity is not an option, but a responsibility for every follower of Jesus.

Marks of Spiritual Growth:

Spiritual maturity goes beyond adding or increasing your knowledge depository. It's about being transformed and becoming more like Christ in character and conduct. A growing believer reflects Jesus more each day— showing significant growth in love, patience, humility, and holiness.

As Ephesians 4:15 (NIV) puts it:

"Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ."

★ Why is Growth Our Responsibility?

1. We are God's temple, and His Spirit dwells within us "Don't you know that you yourselves are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in your midst?" (1 Cor 3:16) – we are called to live a life worthy of our calling.

2. We are commanded to grow in grace and in the knowledge of Christ

"But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." (2 Peter 3:18) – this is a command, not a suggestion.

3. Bearing spiritual fruit is the natural outcome of growth "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." (Galatians 5:22–23) – this is a natural outcome of spiritual maturity.

▲ The Danger of Worldliness:

Paul warns that jealousy and division damage the unity of the church and diminish our witness to the world. Such behaviour reflects that the believer is still in his old self, and not the new creation that has come by being in Christ.

2 Corinthians 5:17 (NIV)

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"

Reflections:

- What are the current barriers to my spiritual growth?
- Am I satisfied with being a spiritual infant, or am I pursuing maturity? In what area is God calling me to grow deeper today?

Overcoming the Stronghold of Evangelism Lk 10:1-9

Introduction:

- 1. Step 1: Start with blessing
- 2. Step 2: Associate with (Him/Her)
- 3. Step 3: Satisfy their need
- 4. Step 4: Proclaim the message

Ignite the Fire of the Gospel

Rom 1:16

The gospel is the power of God. Paul wasn't ashamed of it—he saw it as his highest honour and calling.

In this verse, Paul boldly declares his unwavering faith in the gospel. He knew it wasn't just a religious idea or moral code—it was the very power of God that brings salvation. In a culture that mocked the message of a crucified Savior, Paul stood firm, knowing the gospel was not merely human wisdom but the Truth revealed by God, with the power of salvation.

* The Gospel is God's Power

The gospel isn't merely a set of religious teachings or values it is divine power from God with the power to change lives. It breaks the chains of sin, grants eternal life, and calls people into new lives.

1 Corinthians 1:18 (NIV)

"For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God."

Why We Should Not Be Ashamed:

In Paul's time, many people mocked the message of the gospel because it proclaimed that a crucified Jew was the Savior of the world. But Paul knew that this message was the truth and its God's wisdom and love. He was willing to bear witness to Christ anywhere and was not deterred by human opinion.

Matthew 10:32 (NIV)

"Whoever acknowledges me before others, I will also acknowledge before my Father in heaven."

Let the Fire Burn—Live and Share Christ:

When we truly grasp the weight and beauty of the gospel, something inside us ignites and we will desire for more people to receive God's salvation. Like the prophet Jeremiah, we cannot keep silent.

Jeremiah 20:9 (NIV)

"But if I say, 'I will not mention his word or speak anymore in his name,' his word is in my heart like a fire, a fire shut up in my bones. I am weary of holding it in; indeed, I cannot."

Today, God also calls us to be messengers of the gospel—to live out Christ courageously and authentically in our families, workplaces, schools, and society, so that His power may be revealed through us.

Reflections:

- What fears or concerns are holding me back from sharing the gospel?
- Do I truly believe that the gospel is the power of God to transform lives?
- Am I willing to be unashamed of the gospel for the Lord?
 Who can I share it with today?
